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


During the month of April the Atlantic High Pressure Ridge was the main influencing factor on our weather pattern. However, a weak frontal boundary was responsible for some heavy rainfall experienced on the fourth (4th) while increase moisture in the lower levels produced heavy rainfall on the 18th. Small craft advisories and cautionary notes were issued throughout the month due to above normal sea conditions.

Rainfall this month was within the normal range. Normal rainfall for April ranges from 41.7-7401 mm/ 2-3 in. The longest dry spell during the month of April was the last 10 days of the month. The day with the most rainfall was the 18th when 14.7 mm was recorded.







The Minimum and average daily temperatures were within the normal range for the month of April while the maximum temperature was below normal.

The warmest days were the 23^{rd} and 30^{th} with an average temperature of $27.3^{\circ}\text{C/81}^{\circ}\text{F}$.

Maximum daily sunshine hours was recorded on the 28th (11hrs 24 min).

Minimum sunshine hours was recorded on the 5^{th} (3 hrs. 54min)

The windiest day was the 18th with a daily average wind speed of 15 kts. / 17mph.

Skies were mostly fair throughout April.

- The climate outlook for the season 'May-June-July' is expected to begin the wet season. Some heavy rainfall is expected in May, with frequent heavy rainfall in June and July a bit drier than June.
- Overall for these 3-months rainfall is expected to be below normal while temperature is expected to be normal to above normal.
- Sea Surface Temperatures (SSTs) are presently slightly above normal and are forecasted to remain above normal throughout the season.
- Moisture in the atmosphere is expected to increase slightly during June-July.

Impact:

Risk of flooding, pests & vector borne diseases during heavy rainfall events.
