


## FEBRUARY 2014 IN REVIEW


The weather conditions across St. Maarten during the month of February 2014 was influenced most of the time by the Atlantic High Pressure Ridge however, weak systems were responsible for some minor instability. Mostly partly-cloudy skies were experienced throughout the month with breezy conditions and occasional light showers. Sea conditions were generally moderate throughout February.



March 2014

February 21st was the wettest day when 14% of the month's total rainfall was recorded.






The warmest day was the  $14^{th}$  with an average temperature of  $26.3^{\circ}C/79^{\circ}F$ .

Maximum sunshine hours was recorded on the  $28^{\mbox{th}}$  (10hrs 54mins.)

Minimum sunshine hours was recorded on the  $26^{th}$  ( 3 hrs. 54min)

The windiest day was the  $19^{th}$  with a daily average wind speed of 13 kts. / 15mph.





## According to the Caribbean Outlook Forum : www.cimh.edu.bb/?p=precipoutlook

- The climate outlook for the season ' March–April-May' is expected to be dry, with alternations of sunny days with short spells of showers, mostly without heavy rainfall and becoming wetter in May.
- Rainfall and temperatures are expected to be above normal.
- Sea Surface Temperatures (SSTs) are presently slightly above normal and are forecasted to remain warm throughout the season.
- The Atmosphere is expected to contain little moisture during March-April, but increasing in May and the trade winds are expected to remain stronger than average.

Impact: Reduced Risk of pests & vector borne diseases this season.
