


SEPTEMBER 2014 IN REVIEW

Rainfall amounts continued to be low for the past four months. A few tropical waves crossed the island chain during the month of September. However, the only one which contributed significantly to our rainfall total was one which passed through during September 3rd and 4th. More than half the month's total was recorded on September 3rd.

Rainfall for the month of September was below the normal range. Normal rainfall for September ranges from 94.1-129.4 mm/4-5 in. The day with the most rainfall was the 3^{rd} when 43.4 mm/1.7 in. was recorded. The longest dry spell during the month of September was 6 days from the 25^{th} to 30^{th} .



The latest updated predictions from NOAA increases the likelihood of a below- average 2014 Atlantic Hurricane Season. 7-12 named storms, 3-6 hurricanes with 0-2 major hurricanes.

Remember, that it takes only one major hurricane to make landfall on our island to make it an active season for us. We must also reiterate that other hydro-meteorological features such as heavy rainfall events can have impacts on our lives.

The temperatures recorded during the month of September varied widely compared to the normal range.

The warmest day was the 21st with an average temperature of 29.5°C/85°F.

The day with the most sunshine hours was the 30^{th} (11hrs 18 min).

The day with the least sunshine hours was the $4^{th}\,$ (0 hrs. 0min)

The windiest day was the 13^{th} , with a daily average wind speed of 12 kts. / 14mph.

Skies were cloudy most of the time during the month of September.
